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This week's SC Kids lesson was "An Unlikely Punishment." Use the questions below to review it with your kids.

REVIEW: Jonah 1-4 or Story 69 in *The Gospel Story Bible*; for younger children we recommend reading "*The Jesus Storybook Bible*."

ASK: What did God tell Jonah to do?

Go to Nineveh to tell them about God.

How did Jonah disobey God?

Instead of going to Nineveh, he went the opposite direction to Tarshish.

What were the consequences of Jonah's disobedience?


While Jonah was trying to run away, God sent a big storm, and Jonah was thrown overboard in the middle of the storm.
