Family Worship Guide Week of January 4, 2015



This Sunday was our second week in our New Testament Curriculum. Over the next year and a half we will make our way through the entire New Testament. This Family Worship Guide is intended to give content to discuss with your children throughout the week.

REVIEW

This week's lesson was called "The Birth of Jesus" and finds it's origins in Matthew 1:18-2:15 and Luke 2:1-21. Or for a children's bible version you can refer to Story 80 of the Gospel Story Bible.

DISCUSS

How did Joseph respond when he heard Mary was pregnant? Why?

Confused and upset, because he knew he wasn't the father.

Who came to visit the newborn baby Jesus?

Shepherds and Wise Men.

What was King Herod's nasty plan?

To have the wise men tell him where Jesus was so Herod could kill Jesus to prevent him from becoming King.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

One of the great things about the Gospel Story Curriculum is that for each lesson there are 5 days worth of additional family devotionals. They are complied in a book called "Old Story New: Ten Minute Devotions to Draw Your Family to God."
