

Family Worship Guide Week of February 1, 2015



One of the ways SC Kids partners with parents to make disciples of Jesus is to provide resources that promote discipleship in the home. This Family Worship Guide is intended to give parents content from this week's lesson to discuss with their children throughout the week.

REVIEW

This week's lesson was called "The Wedding Feast" and finds its origins in John 2:1-12. For a children's bible version you can refer to Story 85 of the Gospel Story Bible.

DISCUSS

What did Jesus call the men that followed him?

Disciples.

What happens when they run out of wine at the wedding celebration?

Jesus turns water into wine.

What does this story teach about Jesus?

Jesus is able to meet our needs.

When else does Jesus provide for what we need?

When Jesus died on the cross he provided what we need most - salvation for all who believe. When we trust in Jesus our thirst is satisfied forever!

SING

When we experience the grace of God it causes us to sing! As we teach our children about the grace of God we must teach them how to respond to it as well. So as you are discipling your children remember to teach them to sing. Not only is singing an act of worship, but it can be a great way to help you children learn memory verses and big truths about God. PRAY

Even though God already knows exactly what we need, he wants us to come to him and ask him for help. Philippians 4:6 tells us to "make our requests made known to God." Lead your children in prayer by thanking God for all of the things that he has provided for your family (food, clothes, shelter, health, family, etc.); especially for how Jesus has completely met your needs. Then ask your kids what else they might need help with and ask God for those things.

Be sure to revisit previous questions with your children to maintain memory retention. If you child has mastered the first five questions please lead them on to the next catechism questions. Feel free to tailor this to suit your family and your child's progress.
